

A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents/Carers,

The autumn term has seen a real drive from the staff team to ensure purposeful and enabling learning environments. We have implemented a consistent approach across the school that benefits the children's learning. This approach builds over time and allows the children to see the progression in their learning across a unit. It also gives the children reference points and memory aids so that they can remember what they have previously learnt and recognise how that helps them build knowledge over time. As a staff team we have been learning about the importance of recognising how children learn and the importance of recalling knowledge to aid the long term memory of our pupils.







Similarly, this term we have introduced a comprehensive Responsive teaching and feedback approach which includes marking. We have again based this on current research and educational thinking. It is based on a simple proposition: "Every child in Newton Poppleford Primary School will receive progressive feedback in every lesson in every subject." You will find the policy on our school website under the policy section. As a staff, we can already see the impact on the progression in children's learning and the standard of work they are producing.

We have received another visit this week to look at science in the school. A strong positive theme that came out of this was the opportunities that children had in all year groups to carry out experiments and apply their investigatory skills and develop scientific enquiry. Many children were spoken to and they all spoke so eloquently about how they approach science and what they have learnt across their schooling. Our children are fantastic and we are proud of all of them. A group of children had a more in depth discussion and they were also brilliant at building on the comments of their peers. Well done all!
