At the third checkpoint, all of the teams arrived through the mist and rain, very wet but still with smiles on their faces. At this point they had been walking for 1½ hours. We then drove to the sixth checkpoint where they were once again spotted through the mist and rain, still smiling but looking a bit wearier. Ahead of them was the final 5 miles to the finish line, which is where we then headed to wait for them. After a nervous wait I'm pleased to say that all of the teams made it, some of them running through the finishing line, and it was a proud moment to see them all awarded their medals.

This year's event, once again, proved to be enjoyable, hard work and challenging for all those who took part. Along the way, the teams have learned to support one another, developed their leadership skills and discovered that walking can be enjoyable!

I would like to say how proud I am of all of the students; they have trained hard, including an extra walk during the Easter holidays, and managed to walk over 100 miles in 7 weekends. Both teams – Ryan K, Christian, Benedict, Annie, Isabel, Dan C, Dan B, Kieran, Frankie and Ruby M – performed amazingly with the team of Ryan, Christian, Benedict, Annie and Isabel coming 7<sup>th</sup>, an amazing achievement out of 150 teams most of which were year 7, 8 or 9 pupils. A special mention must go to Harvey who also completed all the practice walks.
