IMPORTANT CONSERVATION WORK IN ADVENTURE ISLAND

Over the past few months, Mrs Taylor and her son, Otto in year 6, have set up various moth traps in Adventure Island in order to investigate and document the variety of species in our wonderful forest school.

Today, Miss Gaston invited Mrs Taylor and Otto into school to share these amazing creatures along with Rowan. Year 2 were extremely attentive; coming up with fantastic questions and making us all think. Mrs Taylor had a brilliant time and said it is always lovely to be able to do 'hands on learning' with such engaging children. Adventure Island is such a wonderful resource for this.

Over 40 difference species were identified during these investigations—no moths were hurt, we hasten to add, and all have been released back into their habitat.

Breakfast/Twilight club from September

PARENT FACTSHEET – JULY 2022

Keep your child safe on Snapchat

Snapchat is an app for sending photos and videos (known as 'Snaps'), and text messages. The 'Stories' feature lets users share photos or videos with all their contacts at once.

Snaps disappear after being opened, usually within seconds. Stories disappear after 24 hours. Images and messages aren't automatically saved on phones.

The **minimum age** to use Snapchat is **13**, but it's easy to sign up if you're younger.

What's the problem?

- There's a risk of seeing sexual content, and of bullying
- Your child's location could be shared automatically with their contacts, which could put them in danger if they have strangers as 'friends' on the app. A new 'Meet Up' feature allows people to get directions to another user's location, if they're sharing their location
- There's a risk of children being 'groomed' by strangers into sharing pictures and information about themselves. Gangs also use apps to groom and recruit children

4 steps to help your child use Snapchat safely

1. Tell your child to only use it with real friends

Anyone could pretend to be a child or teenager online, so encourage your child not to talk to people they don't know in real life. Encourage them not to share information such as what school they go to or where they live with people they don't know offline.

2. Use privacy settings

By default, only 'friends' your child has added on Snapchat can contact them directly and see their story or location, so encourage your child to keep those default settings.

To check and change the settings:

- > Tap the person icon in the top-left of Snapchat, then the cog in the top-right
- Scroll down to the 'Privacy Control' section and tap the relevant options (e.g. 'Contact Me' and 'View My Story')
- > Under 'See My Location', enable 'Ghost Map' to turn location sharing off
- Under 'See Me In Quick Add' you can stop your child's profile from being suggested to strangers as a potential 'friend'

3. Talk to your child about image sharing and being careful about what they share

Even though images disappear in Snapchat, they can be screenshotted and then shared – outside of the original sender's control.

So, remind your child to think carefully about the images they share, and with whom. Before they share anything, tell them to ask: "Would I be happy for other people to see this?"

Country School in your school. Usually these are for Trombone, children in Year 3 upwards and the instruments available to learn are listed below. Our teachers are selected for their instrument knowledge and suitability to work with primary school children. We aim to work with you and your school to increase the musical opportunities here.

Please see our website (address at the bottom of this page) for much more information about our lessons and the general benefits of learning to play an instrument.

We look forward to helping your child begin learning to play a musical instrument and create their own music.

Learning play instrument stimulates and helps coordinate thinking and physical action and, of course, is great fun and very satisfying. Playing also develops confidence, concentration and team skills.

There is increasing evidence to show that the brain functions needed for maths and literacy are enhanced by learning to play a musical instrument and that the beneficial effects of this are greater the longer a child learns for. Learning to play a musical instrument is good for the brain in later life too!

Music Our teachers teach Flute, Clarinet, provides instrumental music lessons Alto Saxophone, Cornet/Trumpet, Guitar, Recorder. (Violin is also available in some schools). We will try to find the best instrument for your child, not our favourite. Many instruments are available in 'mini' versions to accommodate smaller learners.

We have found that children make best progress if they are at least 7 years old when starting. Lessons are usually given during the school day as agreed with your Head Teacher.

Children receive individual attention within a small group (usually 2 or 3 pupils) for 20 minutes ten times a term (usually 5 lessons before half term and 5 after). Different instruments may be present in a group. Lessons include theory, aural training, instrument care, group work and general music skills as well as instrument technique.

Progress is carefully monitored and is recorded in the tutor book. Formal exams are also available when your child attains key levels.

Please see our Risk Assessment on our website. We are working with schools and the latest government guidance to make music lessons 6 pm, Monday to Friday. Covid-safe.

Jflute, cclarinet, small trombones, violin and quitar are available at £18 per term.
