Mid-performers affected by the arrival of a new student just before the exam. JB asked whether we are still doing sufficient mental maths - SV responded that this is being done at least 3 times per week.			
8	Evaluate progress in line with SDP - Significant improvements in SPAG scores.			
9	Review and agree term dates — These will need to be agreed with SLT first. Dates should be generally in line with local secondary schools.	SV		
10	Report on pupil data protection – All data storage is GDPR-compliant. There have not been any data breaches reported.			
11	School build update – According to plan, new bridge should be ready on 1 st October - seems as though this target may not be met, but current temporary bridge is working well. New library should be handed over on 1 st October (although Tarmacing of area in front is already a day or two behind schedule). The HORSA building (a type of temporary hut introduced by the Education Act 1944) has now been demolished. No issues reported in the new building apart from children's hooks being too close together, and the Year 2 whiteboard is failing (to be replaced with a spare when time allows). Teri Murphy of the PTFA has requested the school suggest a specific item that the PTFA can raise money for.
