A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents and carers.

We can't start our Newsletter this week with anything but a huge well done to our year 6 for SATs week and applying themselves so well! Every individual is different and all children have different skills, abilities and qualities that should be celebrated in so many ways. Although SATs tests are only focused on academic achievement, we are immensely proud of the effort that our pupils have put in and how they have applied themselves to their learning this year. Mrs Winkler also deserves a special mention as her positivity, hard work and generally just being fantastic has provided an excellent learning environment and provision for our children this year. The wider year 6 team have also worked extremely hard to help our pupils show the best of themselves, so many thanks to Mrs Fawcett, Mrs McQueen and latterly Mr Goode for their efforts.



Yesterday afternoon Year 6 celebrated with a party for a member of their class, who is not here today, this involved den building and ice lollies. I am sure many of you saw their impressive creation this morning.

In the summer term, we are having an art event to celebrate the end of Art week. After the success of our garden party last year celebrating the King's coronation we will (weather dependent) be inviting the community in to the school for a picnic and celebration of the children's art for the last hour of the school day. We are hoping that many of you will be able to join us. This event is planned for Thursday the 20th June from 2pm.

We are also arranging a walk to school week for week beginning the 10th June. Each pupil will be challenged to travel sustainably (walk, wheel, scoot, cycle or Park and Stride) to school every day for one week using a wallchart to log their journeys. Each class will work collectively to make as many active journeys to school as possible across the week. We hope that you will be able to raise awareness of maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

This week's curriculum focus is on Geography. I would like to offer some insight into two of the areas of focus for us as a school: fieldwork and map skills – the more practical aspects of geography. As a school, we have put a lot of time and effort into developing these and do so in many ways. Map skills involving Atlas work and knowledge of the physical landscape of countries permeates the curriculum but this year we have added in physical map knowledge and compass work through orienteering sessions in PE and Adventure Island as well as our termly hikes. This has really helped the children to understand how OS maps are laid out and the features of them such as: grid references and contour lines showing the topography of the landscape. In the summer term, all classes will be engaging in fieldwork to collect data (making links with the computing curriculum using micro bits or crumbles) and analysing and interpreting the results.

The school's PTFA have also been busy and we are looking forward to a 'break the rules day' in a few week's time. In school, we have recently looked in assembly at British Values including 'The Rule of Law' and I am sure the children will very much enjoy having an opportunity to break a few!


