

Dear All,

This half term and over the Autumn term, we have really encouraged the children to improve their presentation in their work. We are really proud of the way the children have responded and they have produced some fantastic pieces. I am sure many parents may well receive a Marvellous Me update over the next few days and weeks from the school as we continue this effort. I hope that you are aware of the updated curriculum overviews for the Spring term and I know they are also available on our school website. We are asking the children to focus on reading at home over the coming weeks and months. We have made some alterations to the way that we are using accelerated reader in school to enable us to track and promote reading more successfully. Mrs Habbishaw (our reading champion) is now conducting weekly drop-ins with classes and providing the teachers with some information on how well your child is reading at home. We believe that this will help us to further promote a love of reading at our school. We place reading at the heart of our curriculum as



it is the gateway to so much of the learning that takes places in school. As a minimum, we have asked that across the week children read five times or more for an average of twenty minutes each time. We hope that as children move up the school they would read for even longer. I want to express my thanks to everyone in advance for

your support in this. I also hope as always that everyone enjoys their weekends and we look forward to seeing the children again on Monday for some more exciting lessons and learning opportunities.

Year 3 John Sheehan Visit

Year 3 were extremely lucky to be visited by John Sheehan this week to launch their mountains topic in Geography. John is an experienced mountaineer, explorer and all-round adventurer. He shared his experiences of climbing mountains in France and around the rest of the world. He also showed the children the different pieces of equipment he uses are what they are used for. We are really grateful as it was a really memorable and fascinating experience for all children.



Adventure Island Sessions

We have had a brilliant start to our Adventure Island Sessions. In the first week we discussed play parameters (rules) and keeping safe during our sessions. This involved discussing risk and how to minimise it, for example when playing on the rope swings, we all agreed to check no one is in the way before we swing. It was so lovely to see everyone getting stuck in and working hard to get the allotment ready for the growing season!









Important Information


<u>Free School Meals</u> A letter has been emailed to parents this morning regarding free school meals. Please read this letter and apply if you think your child may be eligible, even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and receives a free meal in school. If you are eligible, this will result in more money for our school to support your child's education.

<u>Census Day</u> Thursday 19th January is School Census Day when we need as many children as possible in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to have a school meal as this will determine the funding we receive for the Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) grant. If your child does not normally have a school meal then please allow school to order one for them and bring packed lunch as a back-up. The menu on this day will be roast pork, roasted vegetable tartlet or jacket potatoes.

<u>Change to school dinner menu</u> The menu for Wednesday and Thursday next week will be swapped so the options will be as follows:

Wednesday 18th January: Beef Hot Pot, Quorn dippers or Jacket Potato.

Thursday 19th January: Roast Pork, Vegetable Tartlet or Jacket Potato.

Primary School Applications

You will be aware that children born between 01/09/2018 and 31/08/2019 are entitled to start full time Primary Education in September 2023. The application facility opens on 15th November 2022 and closes at Midnight on 15th January 2023. It is important that parents apply before the closing date, even if they are intending to defer their child's application until later in the academic year, they must secure a place before that decision needs to be made. Even if you have already given details to a primary school, you must apply for a place through the Admissions Team. This is the only way to apply; other forms or lists held by schools will not count.

The School Aged Immunisation Team have now finished visiting Primary Schools to deliver the nasal flu vaccination. The flu season continues until the end of March, and we are already seeing high levels of infection and hospital admissions as a result of the virus. This year the vaccine is an extremely good match to the circulating virus, and it remains of benefit to your child, their family and the community in which they live, to receive the vaccination throughout the flu season.
