Reception & Year 6



<u>Children in Year 6 - Have you applied for your</u> <u>child's school place yet?</u>

The deadline to make your application to the Local Authority is the 31st October 2022. You can apply online by visiting www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline or you can collect a hard copy of the application form from the school office. Please be advised that if you don't apply or apply after the closing date of the 31st October 2022, your application will be considered after all timely applications, and this may mean you miss out on a place at your preferred or local school. Places are not held in reserve for people that apply late. It is import that you make your application before the closing date to give your child the best chance of getting a place at one of your preferred schools. Please don't assume that you don't need to apply and that you will be allocated a place at the local secondary school if you don't. You must make an application and give the Local Authority your preferences. If you don't tell the admissions team where you want your child to go to school, you will run the risk of being allocated at a school that isn't the nearest school or a preferred school, and it may also be a school to which you are unable to transport your child to. If you need help or assistance with the application process, please speak to the school office or contact the admissions team on 03451551019 or email admissions@devon.gov.uk Please note: If you need help from the school office you will need to do this before half term as we are closed from 24th-31st October as 31st October is an inset day.

Gentle Reminders

- Attendance: This is just a reminder that school starts at 09:00 for all children. The doors open at 08:45 and children should be at their desks, ready to start learning at 09:00. The register is taken at 09:00. Children who arrive at 09:00 but before 09:10 will be marked as 'late.' Children who arrive after 09:10 will be marked as 'U' which counts as an unauthorised absence. This obviously doesn't apply for medical appointments, ect. The afternoon registers are taken at 13:00.
- **Dinners:** If your child is going to be late into school for any reason (medical appointment ect) then please let us know if your child would like a school meal that day and what their choice is, in advance, so that we can let the kitchen know with the rest of the school order at the start of the day.
- Threadworm: There have been several cases of threadworm. Please keep a check on your children if they seem more uncomfortable in that area and if they have any symptoms. We would prefer children to be treated as soon as possible from when a positive case has been identified. Children don't need to be off school, but due to it being easily spread it is better that they are treated immediately and potentially siblings too.
