## **Marquee**

The Ptfa is now the proud owner of two preloved 6mx3m marquees donated by Geoff and Sue from Tipton St John. Thank you to Tanisha for spotting the ad and Al and Adrian for transporting them.

## Funding requests

- £170 for a Clive Pig storytelling session for YR, Y1 and Y2 -approved.
- Preschool £150 spend approved from cake sale profits to spend on a water table.
- Yr3 and Yr5 spending advance cake sale money (£100) on a visit from historical storyteller, Steve Manning, who will bring the bronze age/stone age alive for Yr3 and the Anglo Saxons for Yr5.
- Theatre Alibi will visit again with their new show and the PTFA is funding 50% at a cost of £375.
- Yr4 £100 coach funding request approved for a neuroscience workshop at the Science Festival.

## **Bonfire Night**

The Parish Council have offered us the catering with exclusive monopoly on hot food if we sell tickets in the playground, provide stewards and pay a £150 pitch fee (same deal as last year). This is a great community event and raised £770 profit last year.

## Volunteers needed!

Ideas put forward.... Glow in the dark face paint – great idea but the logistics of getting it to glow meant it was discounted. Toasting marshmallows – we are doing this in a couple of months at the xmas fair. Selling sweet waffles with different toppings, messages projected onto the side of the pavilion and people pay to see their message.

The group decided on Henry's mum's idea of glowing ribbon wands. Mrs Odbert has kindly offered to make them.

#### Circus – 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023

Previously we voted to use the Ham but the circus have seen it and said no. It's too narrow and the access isn't suitable.

So now we need other options. Newton Pop is still an option if we meet all of the PC's demands.

Teri has approached St John's School as they have a brilliant field and has asked the council if they can recommend any other council owned suitable spaces.

The field needs electric points, running water, toilets are a bonus. Must be 50mx50m minimum an be flat with access from the road for vans.

Suggestions given by the group – contacting Clinton estates as they are huge land owners, Budleigh cricket club, Sidmouth Rugby club, contacting Greendale as they are big landowners

Sidmouth Cricket Club ruled out due to access.

Investigations are still being made to try and find a venue.

To remind everyone the offer from the Newton Poppleford PC....

OFFER ONE. NEWTON POPPLEFORD PLAYING FIELDS. The PC were very reluctant and initially said no. We have been back and forth and they have now said yes9with a majority vote) with caveats.

We need to pay (approx. £30) for a professional clean of the toilets in the Pavilion, alternatively they can be shut off and we bring in Portaloos (not costed yet). If we are using the Pavilion loos then we need to post a steward for the duration of the show to protect the pavilion. Their preference is we use portaloos and keep the pavilion locked.

They want a security deposit of  $\pm 1000$ . This is returnable unless they feel we have damaged the field, cricket pitch or pavilion building, in which case it is used against the repair. If the repair bill exceeds  $\pm 1000$  then they will bill us for the remainder.

Their charge is TBC but will not exceed the 24-hour private hire rate of £408.

We need to provide 9 stewards (4 to assist the circus staff on the door as requested by them. 4 to man various car parks, 1 to patrol the pavilion and playing fields during the show, as requested by the PC).

We will open up the school playground as a carpark to hopefully encourage more visitors from outside the parish.
