#### **Gentle Reminders & Important Information**

The roadside around the school at the top of School Lane, Dotton Lane, Glebelands, Lower Farthings and Turner Close are particular areas to be aware of as they can be very congested and become dangerous. As a school community, this has to be recognised as a serious issue and something that we must all share in as a collective responsibility.
