Year 1 Environmental Workshop

Year 1 had an environmental workshop on Tuesday. We learnt all about how to sort our rubbish into different groups for recycling. We had to identify what material each item was made of, before we chose the correct container. We also learnt about how different materials get recycled and what they can get turned into.

Year 3 Trip To Lyme Regis

On Wednesday 22nd February, Year 3 had an amazing trip to Lyme Regis, where we learned lots about Mary Anning and fossils. We started the day with checking our bags, finding a buddy and making sure we knew who our responsible adult for the day was. Then we got on the coach and made our way to Lyme Regis museum.

In the museum, we met Chris who taught us all about fossils. He explained what ammonites and ichthyosaurs look like, how fossils have been formed and how to find and recognise them on the beach. After this we had a close look at the geology room of the museum, where there are lots of fossils on display, including an ichthyosaurus that Mary Anning found. Some of the bones and the skulls In this room were much bigger then we ever expected. After lunch we visited Mary Anning's statue at the end of the walkway and her grave



on the cemetery close to the museum. We then walked to the beach, looked at the different layers in the sedimentary rocks in the cliffs and saw some huge ammonites which had fallen out of the cliff. Chris told us how important it is to stay well away from them as the cliffs can crumble at any time. We then went onto the beach to look for fossils....and we found lots! We found ammonites, fools gold and even found a vertebrate of an ichthyosaurus! Chris told us we had done exceptionally well! We then packed up our bags and made sure we kept our fossils safe in them, before getting back on the coach to school. Thanks to the enthusiastic, well-behaved children and thanks to the adults who were there to help us, we had a fantastic day out!







Adventure Island

Since returning to school after the half term break, years 1 and 2 have been very busy in the allotment. We have been digging, weeding, spreading compost and sowing seeds, all the while sharing our thoughts and ideas about what seeds need to grow into strong healthy plants. All classes will visit the allotment in the coming weeks and will be working in one another's beds in a collective way, ensuring everybody has plenty to do as we share out all of the jobs! Last week, years 3,4,5 and 6 learnt how to tie a timber hitch knot and then worked in teams to drag large log stumps around to create some different seating areas. It was brilliant to see the children working together and helping one another and I am sure they will find knowing how to tie a timber hitch handy for future sessions!


